The activities of **NSS unit** are categorized under Regular programme, Special Camp and Red Ribbon Camp.

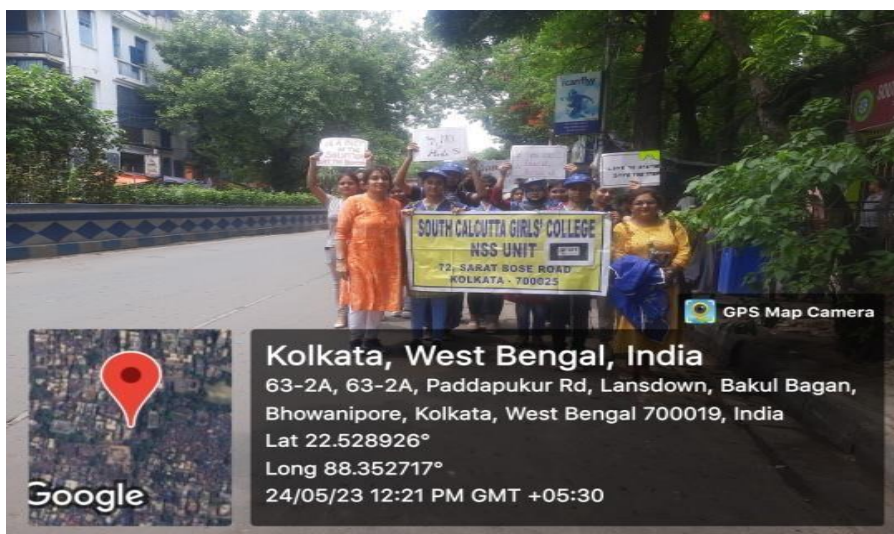
## 1. ACTIVITIES OF NSS UNIT

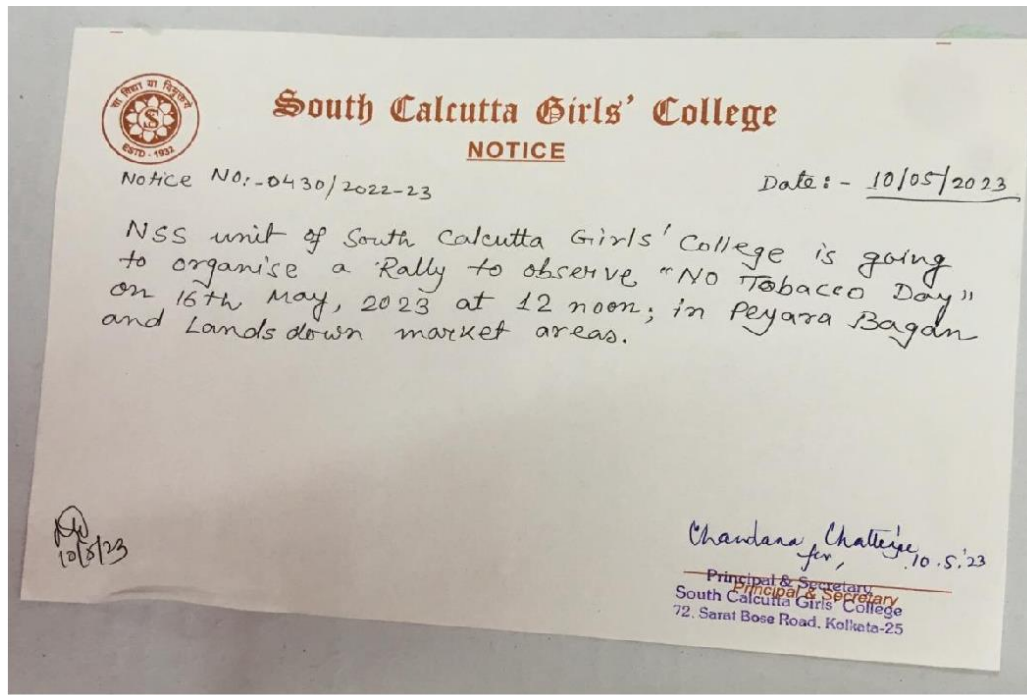

## OBSERVATION OF “NO TOBACCO DAY” ON 16.05.2023

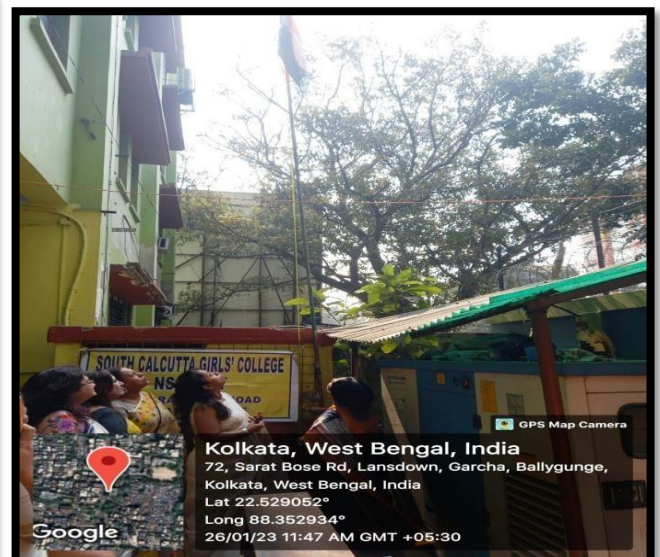
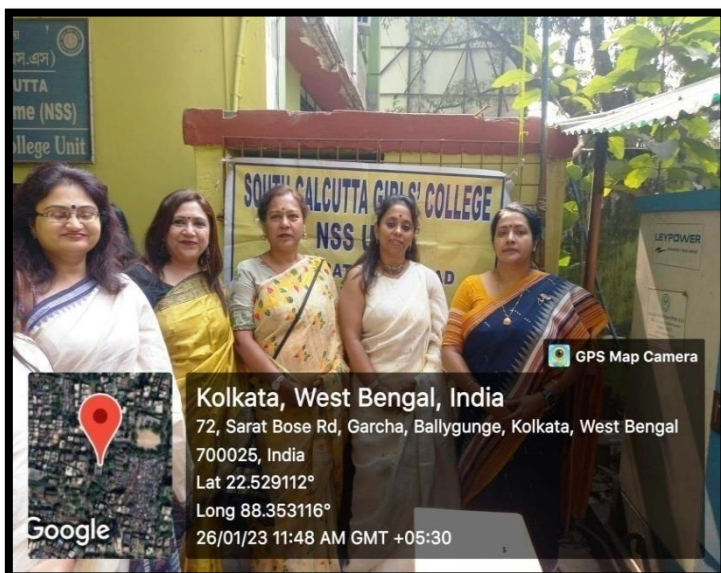
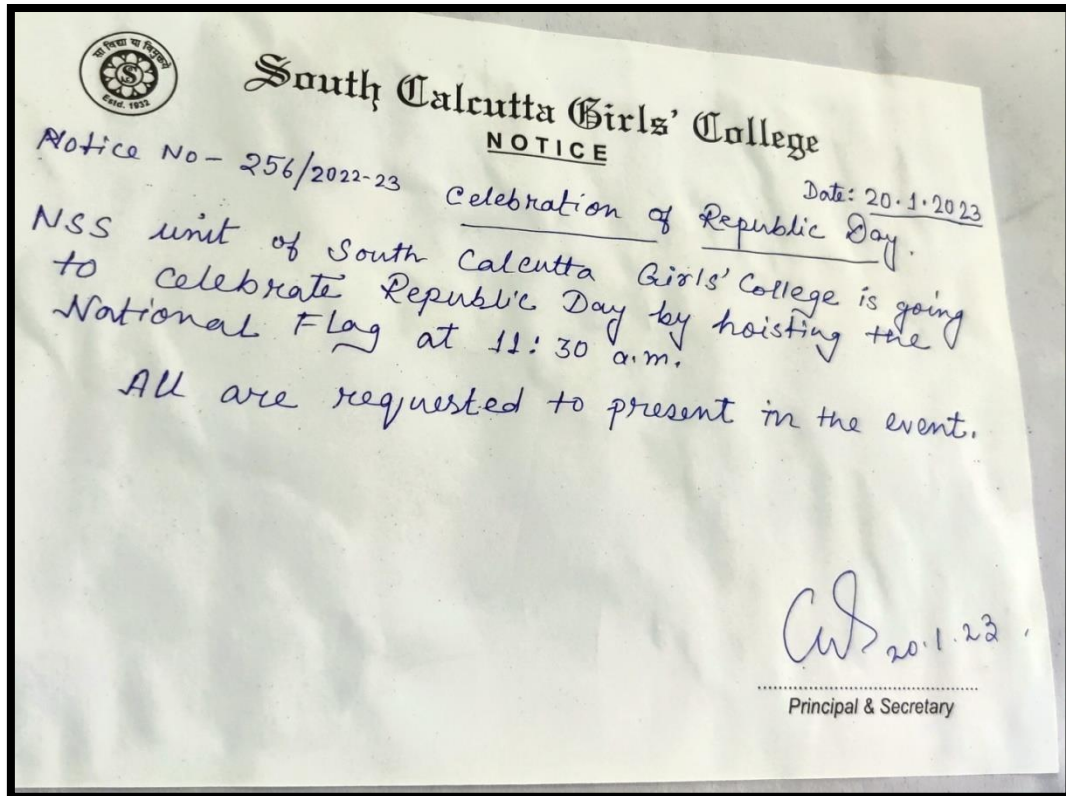

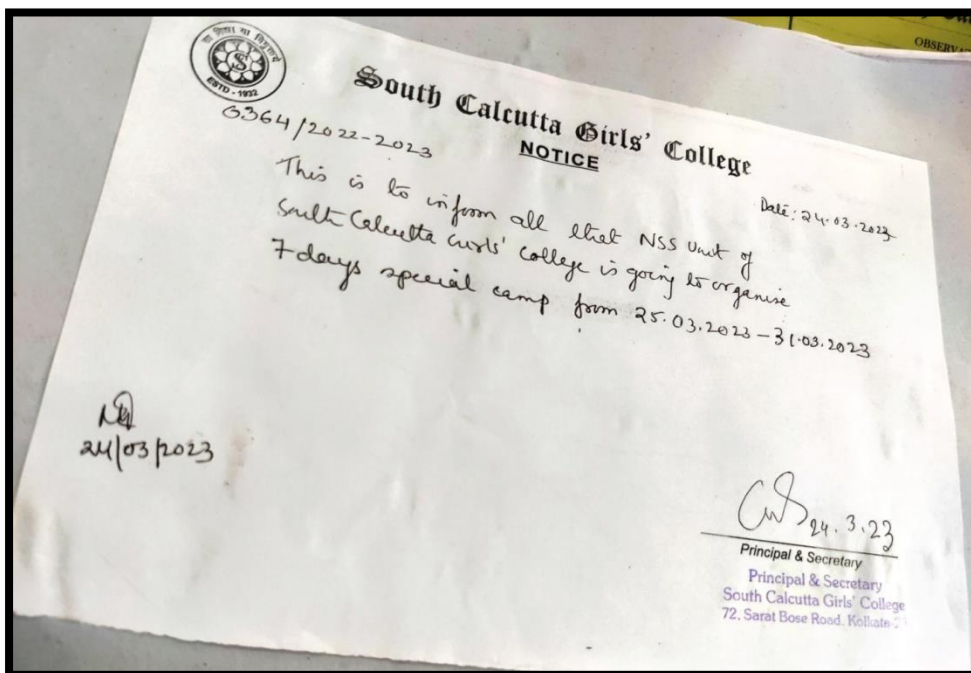

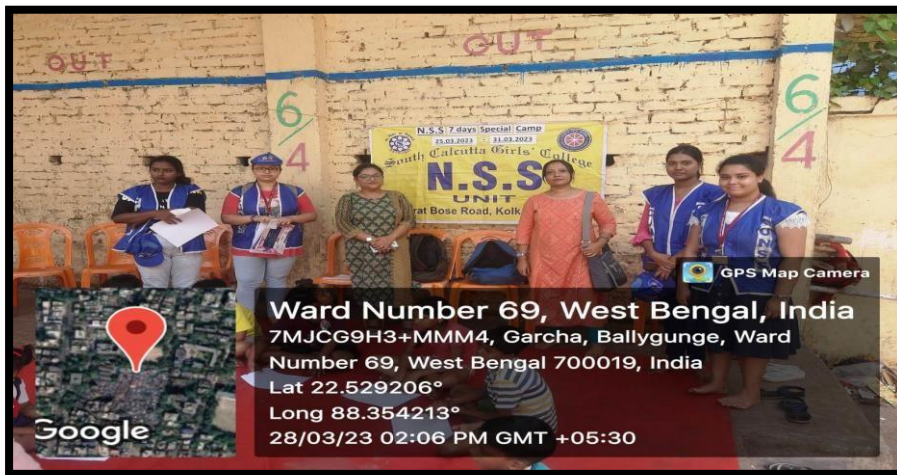
## NSS SPECIAL CAMP: (25<sup>th</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023)

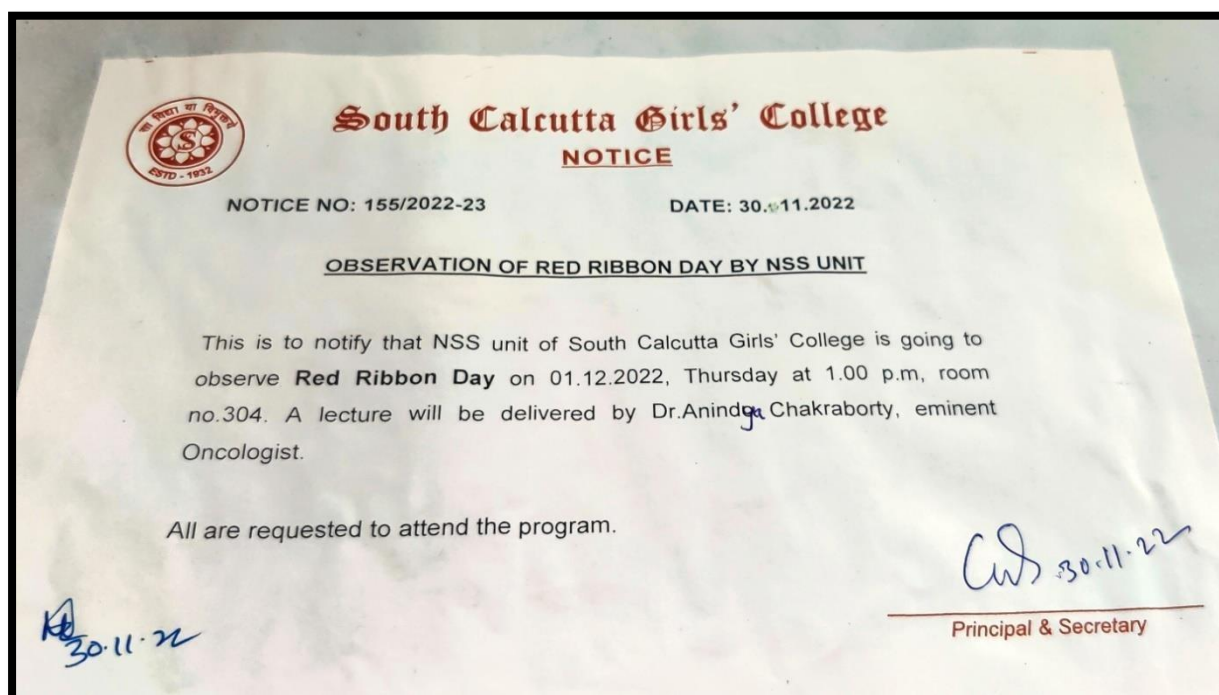

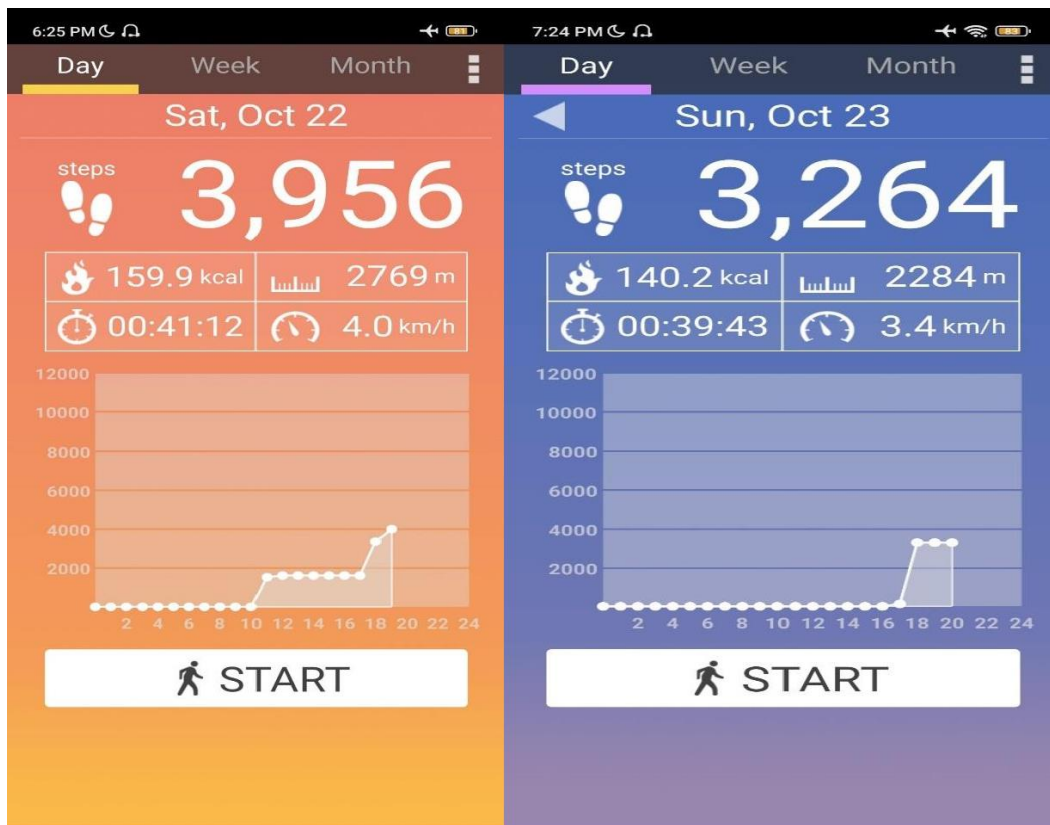
HELD ON 22<sup>nd</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August 2022



To commemorate the 75<sup>th</sup> year of India's Independence, "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" and "Fit India Mission" has conceptualized "Fit India Freedom Run". This year, Fit India Mission conducted the third edition of the Fit India Freedom Run 3.0 from 2<sup>nd</sup> - 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2022, under the flagship initiative, Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM). As an integral part of this initiative, the Physical Activity Club of South Calcutta Girls' College organized a series of fitness-related activities from 22<sup>nd</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2022. Students, teachers and staff of the College participated in this initiative actively and enthusiastically. Every day, 40 participants performed different physical activities like walking, running, jogging, yoga, freehand exercises etc. and reported the details of their work out like the distance covered and time spent in these activities to the Physical Activity Club. ## ADULT LITERACY PROGRAMME IN PEYERABAGAN SLUM AREA

South Calcutta Girls' College, as part of the Extension program, has been working in the Peyerabagan slum area located in the vicinity of our College, wherein the Adult Literacy programme commenced in 2015. The Adult Literacy program has been undertaken to develop sense of social responsibility among students and to lend a helping hand to the under-privileged women in this locality. The College, in collaboration with Peyerabagan Bustee Welfare Centre, has been conducting this programme for the housewives. Our student volunteers participate in the programme, which is held throughout the year. Every week, 2-3 student volunteers conduct classes in this area. Our College library is also involved with this programme and all relevant and necessary books are provided by the Library. The total number of participants for this academic year was **35**.

#### Feedback Report

Bustee Welfare Centre operates an Adult Literacy Centre for the women from disadvantaged families. Basic literacy classes are organized to impart functional literacy among these women who have never got any opportunity to attend school or may have left school at very early stage of their lives. Approximately 25-30 women attend the centre.

Like previous years this year also few students from South Calcutta Girls' College worked as volunteer in this centre. The students helped the learners to learn their lessons and assisted them individually to read and write. They worked in the centre up to third week of March 2020 as the educational institutions were declared closed due to nation-wide lockdown.

The learners were greatly benefitted by the support of these students.
