## DSC/CC 1/ Political Theory: Foundational Concepts

## **Module I**

## Topic 1: Conceptualising the *Political*. Power and Authority

- To understand the basic concept of Politics, the meaning and implication of the term 'political' are to be properly comprehended. Learning this topic following outcomes may be recorded:
- > It helps in developing political awareness and enhancing informed decision-making power.
- Understanding politics and defining *political* allows students to actively participate in democracy. This can range from voting in elections to participating in peaceful protests or even running for office.
- It enhances critical thinking skills. It encourages us to question information, consider different perspectives, and make reasoned arguments regarding events and issues having political connotations.
- The concept of power and the power struggle is the basis of Politics. To know how power becomes legitimized, one must understand the difference between power to and power over as well as the concept of dominance and authority. This topic helps in building the consciousness of the students about how domination can be ended or questioned and to become aware of one's duty to respect legitimized authority.

### Topic 2: State, Nation, Sovereignty

- Concepts attempts to familiarize the students with the most significant aspects related to the discipline of Political Science.
- These vital aspects are intended to build the intellectual foundation of the students of Political Science.
- Develop the skills required to understand and assess the critical concepts in Political Theory.

# Topic 3: Law, Liberty and Equality (Interrelationships)

### **Module II**

### Topic 5: Democracy (including classifications of David Held); Authoritarianism

- > Classify different models of democracy from ancient types to contemporary ones.
- > Assess the concept of dictatorship and compare democracy and dictatorship.

### **Topic 6: Political obligation. Citizenship**

- This topic will also teach them the concept of citizenship, the process of acquisition of citizenship as well as the methods by which citizenship can be revoked.

# SEC-1 Democratic Awareness through Legal Literacy

### Module I

# Topic 1: Basic understanding: Legal provisions of FIR, General Diary, Arrest, Bail, Search, and Seizure. Evidence and Criminal Procedure Code.

This topic will generate general awareness among students regarding the fundamental legal provisions like FIR, General Diary, Arrest, Bail, Search, Seizure, evidence, and criminal procedure court as well as their applications.

# Topic 2: Laws on offences against women, children and adolescents, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

- This topic helps undergraduate students acquire knowledge about different legal provisions about the weaker sections of society like women, children and adolescents, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and to make them aware of duties to explore opportunities and challenges.
- Female students are often unaware of the legal consequences of different crimes that are committed against them. This topic makes them understand in detail the nature of such various gender-based offences and the rooms for their redressal.
- It helps the children and backward classes in the same way when different crimes are committed which threaten their existence.

## Topic 3: Personal laws and customary law in India (overview)

- Understand deeply rooted in the socio-cultural fabric of Indian communities, has evolved over centuries, shaping and being shaped by the lives of the people it governs.
- Delves into the essence, significance and contemporary relevance of customary law in India, illuminating its role in the legal system and the challenges it faces in the modern era.

## Topic 4: Labour Laws (Overview); Environmental Laws (Overview)

- > Describe fundamental concepts and nature of Industrial Relations.
- > To understand the nature and role of trade unions for workers and industries.
- > To study the relevance of collective bargaining and its impact on employee-management relations.
- This topic also seeks to introduce to students the fundamental features of the legal regime governing labour rights in India.
- It provides a nuanced understanding of the fundamental paradox of the discipline of Labour Law in India in as much as it is over-legislated and workers are under-protected.
- This topic has been designed to underscore the interconnectedness of different elements of labour protection.
- Environmental degradation is the pressing problem of our age. Studying environmental laws not only fulfils the need to understand our surroundings but also its protection.
- > It generates environmental consciousness among students as well.

### **Module II**

### Topic 5: Laws related to contract and consumer rights

This topic educates students about the basic legal concepts related to contract law and provisions of consumer rights.

## **Topic 6: Laws on cybercrime:**

- In the present digital world, people are very vulnerable to the threats of cybercrime. This topic helps in understanding what is considered as cyber crimes, and what are the laws associated with them; How undergraduate students can become soft targets and how to get rid of such problems.
