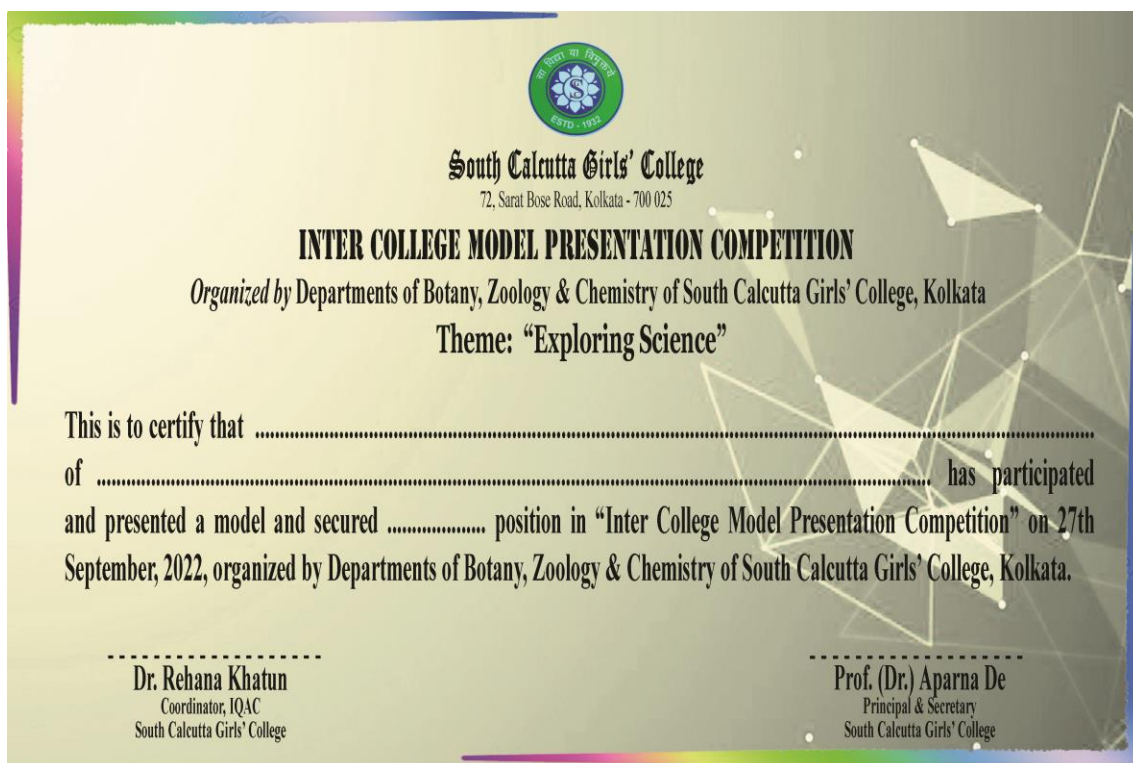

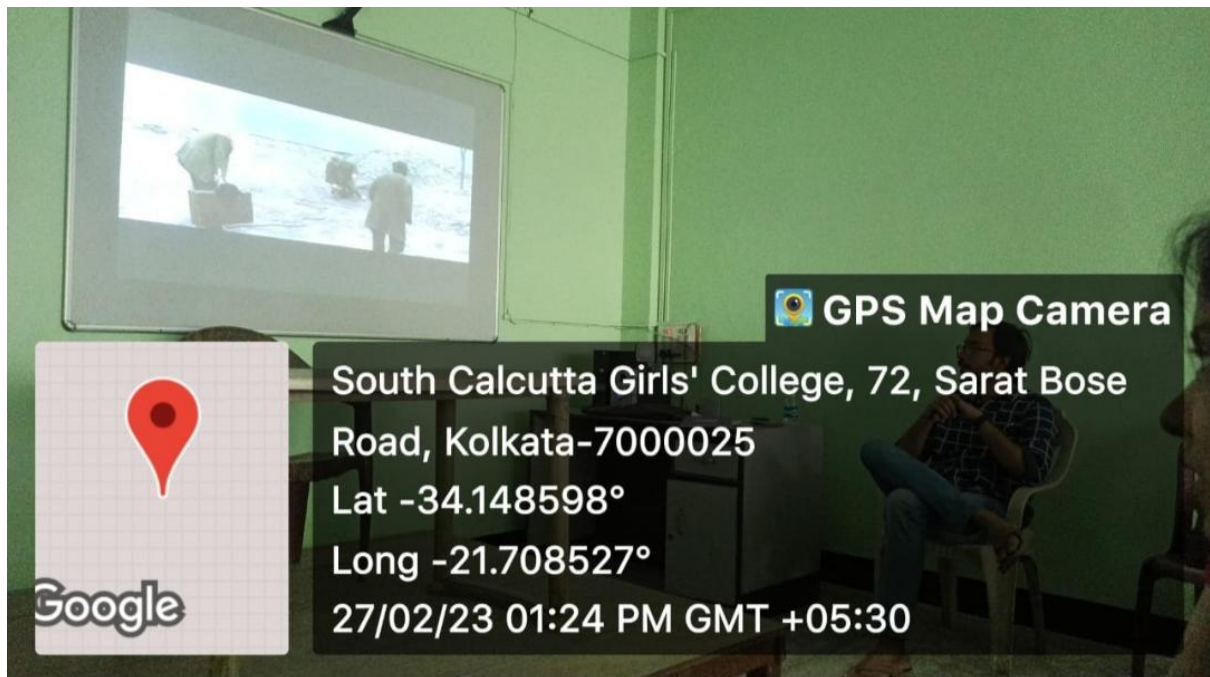


Image 1 : Departmental Teacher with the students during the movie screening program

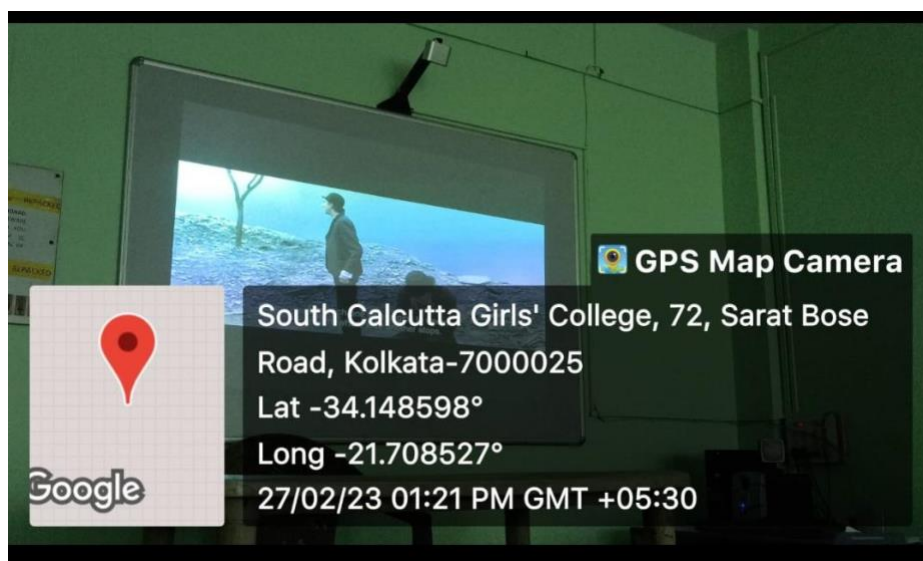


Image 2 : Parts of the Movie

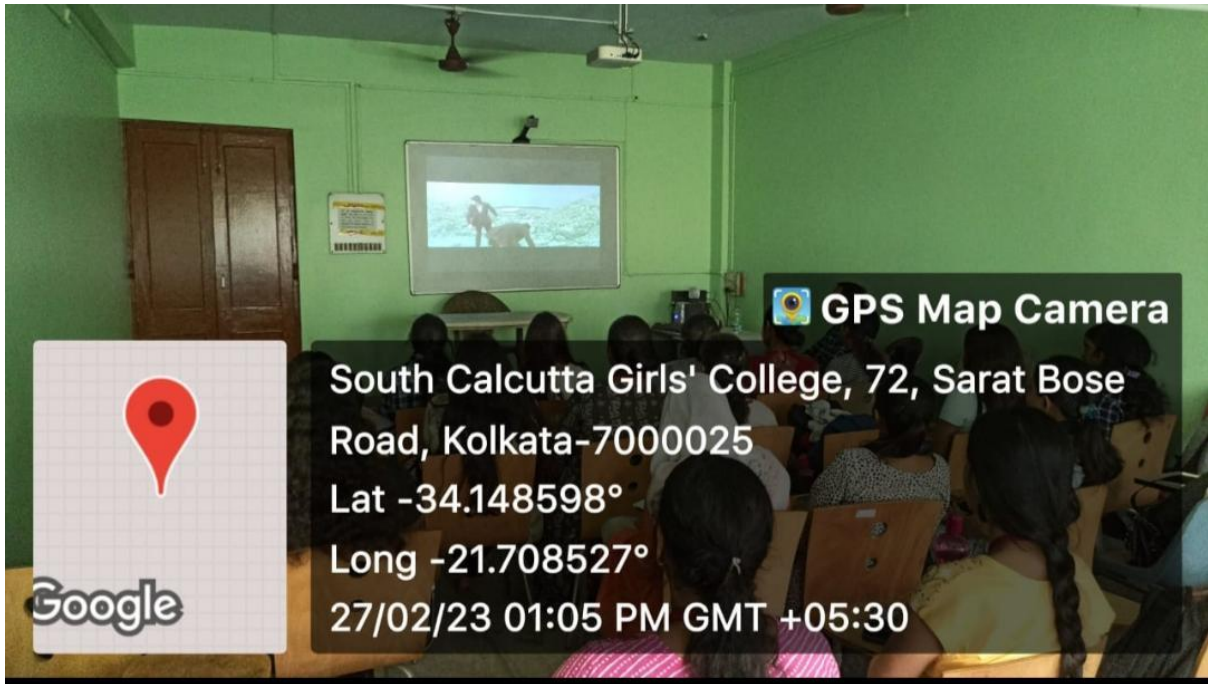


Image 3 : Students Attending the Movie Screening

Purpose and Outcome	The aim of the Program was to celebrate the World Suicide Prevention Day for developing awareness and orienting about the various preventive measures which essentially need to be undertaken. Inter-departmental poster presentation competition was organized followed by a Role-Play conducted by the Semester-5 Honours students of the Department of Psychology. Teaching and Non-Teaching staff and students of the various departments of the College have participated in the program. Participants shared that the organization of the program was fabulous and they have gained an enriching experiences after attending this program.

PRE-SOCRATIC PHILOSOPHERS

Thales

Thales was a Greek mathematician, astronomer, statesman and pre-socratic philosopher. From Miletus in Ionia, Asia Minor. In mathematics Thales used geometry to calculate the heights of pyramids and the distance of ships from the shore. He is the first known individual to use deductive reasoning, applied to geometry, by deriving four corollaries to Thales' theory. He is also the first known to whom a mathematical discovery has been attributed. He is often referred to as the father of Science.



Empedocles

Born in Agrigento in 494 B.C. Empedocles was a Greek pre-socratic philosopher. His philosophy is best known for originating the cosmogonic theory of the four classical elements referred to the earth, water, air and fire. He also proposed forces he called Love and Strife which would mix and separate elements respectively. Empedocles challenged the practice of animal sacrifice and killing animals for food. He developed a distinctive doctrine of reincarnation.



Heraclitus

Heraclitus asserted that the world exists as a coherent system in which a change in one direction is ultimately balanced by a corresponding change in another. He was born in Ephesus, Anatolia. He was a pre-Socratic Greek philosopher. He is remembered for his cosmology, in which fire forms the basic material principle of an orderly universe. His famous quote was "No man ever steps in the same river twice, for it's not the same river and he is not the same man. There is nothing permanent except change."



Parmenides

Parmenides was a Greek philosopher from Elea in Southern Italy, who founded Eleaticism, one of the leading pre-socratic schools of Greek thought. His general teaching has been diligently reconstructed from the few surviving fragments of his principal work a lengthy three-part verse composition titled 'On Nature'. His philosophy was based on idealistic monism. His biggest argument was that change doesn't exist. His explanation is that we can see change, but our senses are not reliable, and they create the illusion of change.



Anaxagoras

Anaxagoras of Clazomenae, a Greek philosopher of the 5th century B.C. was the first of the pre-Socratic philosophers to live in Athens. He propounded a physical theory of "everything-in-everything", and claimed that mind was the motive cause of the cosmos. He was the first to give a correct explanation of the eclipses and was both famous and notorious for his scientific theories. He maintained that the original state of the cosmos was all its ingredients mixed.



Democritus

Democritus known in antiquity as the 'laughing philosopher' because of his emphasis on the value of 'cheerfulness', was one of the two founders of ancient atomist theory. He was born in 460 B.C. and was a citizen of Abdera. He introduced the idea of the atom as the basic building block matter. He thought that atoms are tiny, uncuttable, solid particles that are surrounded by empty space and constantly at random.

① Explain how goods are classified on the basis of Income elasticity of demand?

② Ans: Income elastic elasticity of demand is defined as the proportionate change in quantity demanded due to proportionate change in income.

$$\eta = \frac{\frac{\Delta x}{x} \times 100}{\frac{\Delta M}{M} \times 100} = \frac{\Delta x}{\Delta M} \cdot \frac{M}{x}$$

Here, Δx and ΔM are the changes in quantity demanded and income, respectively and M and x are the initial levels of income and quantity demanded.

Depending on the values of the income elasticity of demand, goods can be broadly categorized as inferior and normal goods.

□ Normal Goods :- Normal goods whose income elasticity of demand is between zero and one are necessity goods, which are products and services that consumers will buy regardless of changes in their income levels.

Ex :- Necessity goods ~~whose income elasticity~~

of demand is between and services include tobacco products, haircuts, water and electricity. if x is a normal good then

□ Inferior Goods :- As income rises, the proportion of total consumer expenditures on necessity goods typically declines. Inferior goods have negative income elasticity, if x is a inferior good then

② How is cross price elasticity of demand used to classify goods?

Ans:- ~~Cross pri~~ The concept of cross price elasticity of demand is used to classify whether or not products are 'substitutes' or 'complements'.

If the cross price elasticity is positive the goods are substitutes, and if the cross price elasticity are negative the goods are complements.

□ For substitute goods, if the price of x goods goes up the demand for y good goes up and ~~the price of~~ when the price of y good goes up, the demand for x good goes up.

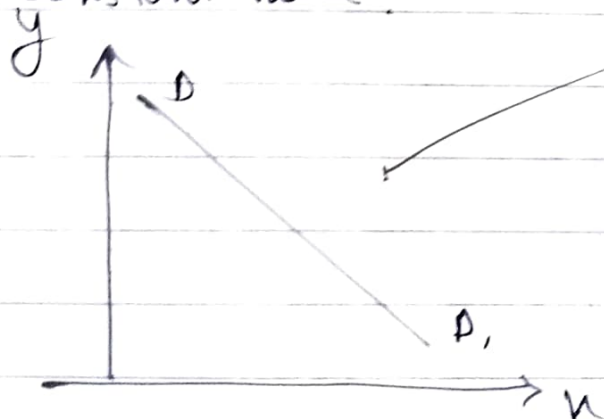
