BRIEF NOTE OF THE SPEECH DELIVERED BY DR. KANTI LAL DAS,  
PROFESSOR OF PHILOSOPHY, NORTH BENGAL UNIVERSITY IN  
THE NATIONAL WEBINAR ON “ETHICS IN BUSINESS AND PUBLIC  
RELATIONS: THE MODERN PARADOX”

The National Webinar was promoted by IQAC and jointly organized by Department of Journalism and Mass Communication and Department of Philosophy on 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2020.

Professor Das mentioned the famous allegation that philosophy is a close-door discipline that is involved in the inward cultivation of soul and mind. It is not connected with the empirical world. Against this allegation, he pointed out the practical aspects of philosophy. Business may be personal, professional or corporate. Each of it has an ethical dimension. He compared the trends of old times and the recent period. Previously, people believed that If character is lost, everything is lost. If health is lost, something is lost. If money is lost, nothing is lost. He remarked that nowadays, people believe that If character is lost, nothing is lost. If money is lost, everything is lost. Accumulation of wealth is certainly important in business but men should cultivate the cardinal virtues as mentioned by Plato. He mentioned the names of famous businessmen who have followed unethical ways and at the same time, he spoke of the Tata's and Birla who are the pioneers of Indian business and economy.

There are certain myths of business. There has been a tendency to emphasize the negative elements of business that it involves malpractices. People seem to give their own interpretations. Many people seem to identify law with ethics. He reminded us that ethics covers a broader field than law. So, it is incorrect to say that what is legal is ethical. Ethics has moral universality and it is unconditional in nature. We should eliminate the myths. Business ethics should be studied to improve business and to overcome malpractices. We need honest entrepreneurs who have integrity of character. In the lecture, he mentioned the famous writing of Kant named “Perpetual Peace” where he said that we need moral politicians. He also spoke of Professor Amartya Sen, John Rawls and Dr. B. R. Ambedkar. He referred to the different characters of the Mahabharata and he ended his lecture by pointing out the essential fact that any business should involve goodwill and concern for others.

## **Report of the Seminar on “Mind and Mental States” on 18.12.2019**

A Seminar on “Mind and Mental States: East and West” was organized by the Department of Philosophy on 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2019 at 1PM. Dr. J.L. Shaw, Professor of Philosophy, Victoria University, New Zealand was the Speaker. He discussed the concept of mind both from the Western and Eastern philosophical perspectives. It was followed by a question-and-answer session. There were 60 participants.

### **Details of Resource Person**

Professor Jaysankar Lal Shaw is a bright star among Indian philosophers and especially those who spread the message of Indian philosophy in the Western world. He had his education at Calcutta University and received his Ph.D. at Rice University, Houston, Texas. He taught at Jadavpur University, Calcutta, at the University of Alabama, USA, and at the University of Hawaii. The majority of his career was spent as tenured Associate Professor School of History, Philosophy, Political Science & International Relations, at Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand. His main focus is on logic, metaphysics, and science of language. For years he has tirelessly tried to spread Indian metaphysics and logic in the Western academia. Some of his important works are:

Logic and Metaphysics ; Some Logical Problems Concerning Existence ; Cognition of Cognition; Causality and Its Application: Samkhya, Bauddha and Nyaya ; The Nyaya on Meaning: A Commentary on Pandit Visvabandhu; Human Beings and Freedom: An Interdisciplinary Perspective . Professor Shaw’s untiring effort to solve some of the problems of contemporary philosophy of language, logic, epistemology, metaphysics and morals from the perspectives of classical Indian philosophers or systems of philosophy is deserving of a tribute. This came in the shape of publication of Comparative Philosophy and J.L. Shaw: published by Springer; the book celebrates and honours his scholarly achievements. Original works by leading international philosophers and logicians are presented here, exploring themes such as: meaning, negation, perception and Indian and Buddhist systems of philosophy, especially Nyaya perspectives.

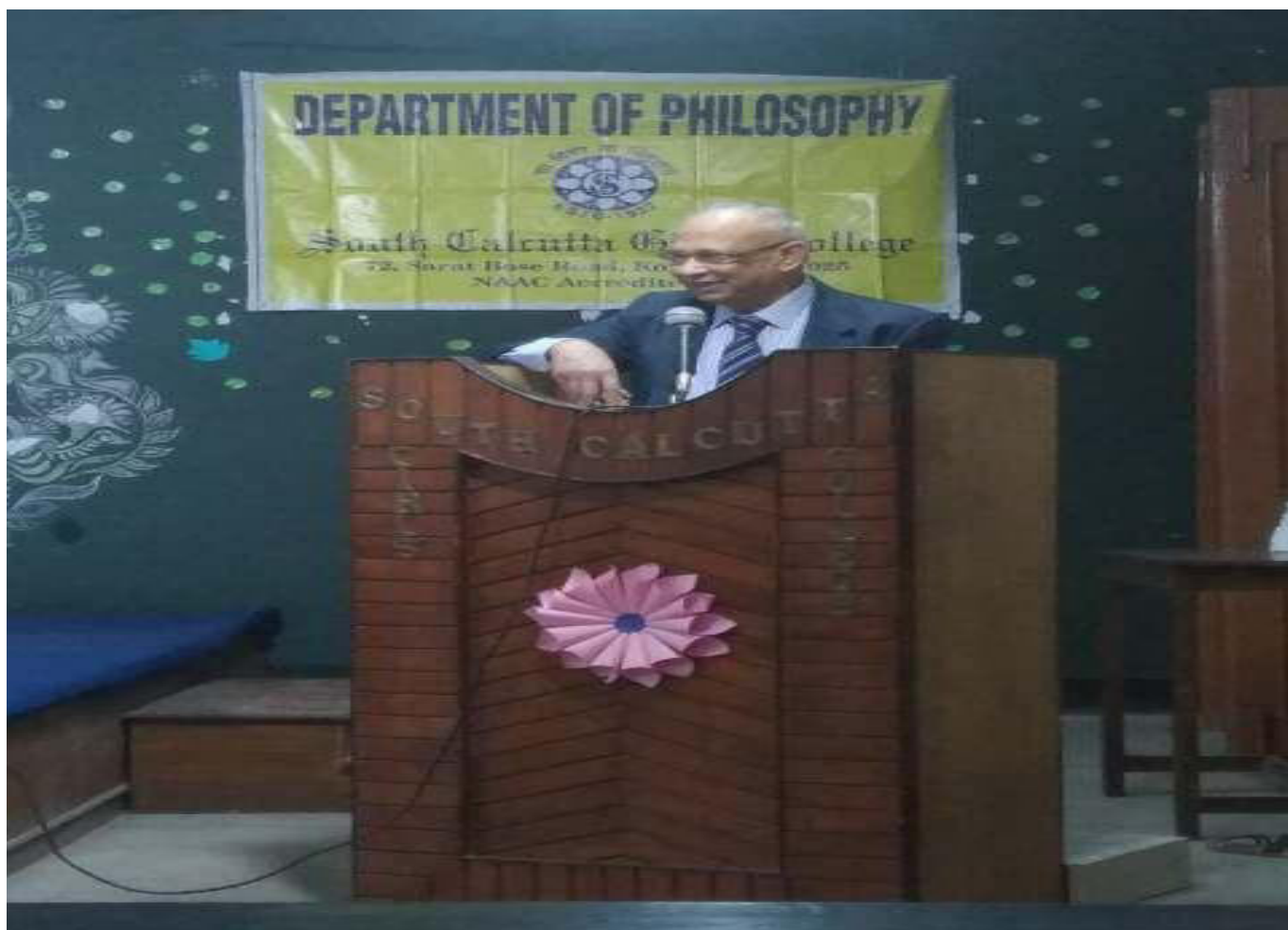
As a teacher he had taught his students to research deeply and understand the issues. He taught how to stop talking about other people, and just argue for the position; make sure they are addressing problems that are raised by other figures that are also timeless; to make the argument and raise objections in that matter and challenge the position; and finally take the position as far as it goes no matter what. Don't quit.

About 16 years ago under Professor Shaw's guidance Society **for Global Philosophy and Culture** was set up in Kolkata. The aim is to promote interest in philosophy and help students of philosophy departments to have a greater understanding. Since then every year the Society has been holding various seminars. 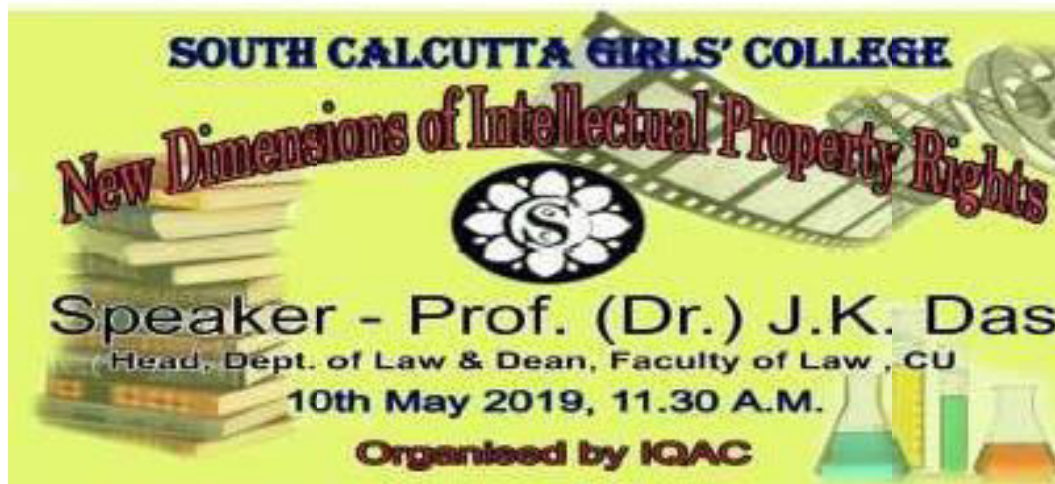

## Seminar of the Department of Philosophy 2017-2018

**Report of ICPR Sponsored Two Day National Seminar**

**On**

**“The Moral Dilemma between Life and Death: East and West”**

**Organized by**

**The Department of Philosophy, South Calcutta Girls' College**

The Department of Philosophy, South Calcutta Girls' College organised a two-day National Seminar on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2017 with the sponsorship support from ICPR. The theme of the seminar was “The Moral Dilemma between Life and Death: East and West”. The seminar hosted ten eminent speakers from various disciplines who shared a common space for interdisciplinary outlook on the prescribed theme. Papers presented in the seminar reflecting the core issues of life and death from different perspectives were exceptionally high on intellectual value, became the highlights of the event.

The first day of the seminar set forth a soothing beginning with ‘Mangalacharanam’ by a group of students of the college. The Welcome Address delivered by the Principal, Dr. Aparna De, was very encouraging and her anticipation for the success of the event motivated the audience. Lighting the candle ceremony took place by all the distinguished guests in the inaugural session of the day. After that, felicitation of the guests by the Principal eventuated.

The Address by the Chief Guest, Prof. Basab Chaudhuri, Honourable Vice-Chancellor, West Bengal State University, was very inspiring. He expressed his expectation that some positive conclusions deduced from the seminar. By quoting from the writings of Rabindranath Tagore, he remarked that preference should be given to life over death. The message exhibiting the hope of the grand success of the event from Sri Subrata Mukherjee, Honourable Minister, Government of West Bengal and President, Governing Body, South Calcutta Girls' College was read out in the seminar by the co-ordinator due to his unavailability. Keynote Address was delivered by respected Swami Supamananda, Secretary, The Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture, Golpark. In his speech, he reminded the mankind to perform their social responsibility as a human being. In the concluding part of his lecture, he emphasised the importance of organ donation.

A short introduction of the theme by the organizer, Dr. Nilina Ghose, unfolded the thrust areas intended to be highlighted in the seminar. She extended vote of thanks on behalf of the department and urged everyone to join in for high tea.

**First technical session** was chaired by Prof. Adarasupally Nataraju, Department of Philosophy, Assam University and two eminent speakers were Dr. Bhaskarjit Neog, Centre for Philosophy, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University and Prof. Chhanda Chakraborti, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Kharagpur.

Dr. Neog's presentation titled “Moral dilemmas and Incommensurable Values” highlighted the issue of the genuine possibility of moral dilemmas by raising the question, Is moral

dilemma real or imaginary? This paper argued in favour of the existence of moral dilemmas by subscribing to a thesis of incommensurability of values.

Another paper titled "Rape-induced pregnancy and Late term Abortions, India: The Moral Dilemma between Life and Death" by Prof. Chhanda Chakraborti emphasised the issue of late term abortion specially in cases of rape induced pregnancy. Several cases of late term abortions, the legal judgements based on the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act, 1971, the advice of the medical experts were incorporated in this paper to demonstrate ethical queries. This paper attempted to investigate the moral reasons behind the moral choice in such cases.

These presentations were followed by Q&A session and final remarks by the Chair. This session ended with the announcement of lunch break.

**Next session** of the day, **session two**, was chaired by Prof. Priyambada Sarkar, Department of Philosophy, University of Calcutta and had Prof. Somnath Chakraborty, Formerly Professor and Chair, Department of Philosophy and Religion, Visva-Bharati, Santiniketan and Smt. Anasua Roychowdhury, Film maker, as the speaker.

Prof. Chakraborty's presentation titled "The Ethics of Life and Death: Some Issues" pointed on the issue that a dilemma includes numbers of assumptions each of which needs clarification. Special emphasis had been given on the issue whether death can be considered as a case of moral dilemma by considering the assumption that 'Death is a necessary evil and it is morally obligatory not to sponsor it'. This paper highlighted the view of Epicurus who contested the assumption that death is an evil.

Another paper titled "Death in the time of war and love" was presented by Smt. Roychowdhury by screening a short film "Bhalobasar Sahar," This film portrayed the idea of life and death from a larger perspective of contemporary reality.

After the presentations the Chair summarised the paper for an understanding of them for the students. Questions raised in this session were well answered by the speakers.

Third session was chaired by Prof. Adarasupally Nataraju, Department of Philosophy, Assam University and the speaker was Dr. Pralayankar Bhattacharya, Department of Philosophy, University of Calcutta.

Dr. Bhattacharya's presentation titled "Is Capital Punishment a case of genuine moral dilemma between life and death?" highlighted three issues related to capital punishment-

1. Is capital punishment a genuine case of moral dilemma?
2. How can we solve the dilemma?
3. If we can really solve then can we support capital punishment?

This paper attempted to enquire into the difference between moral conflicts and moral dilemmas. The debate between the retributivist and consequentialist in favour of and against capital punishment had been discussed in this paper.

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This session continued with the presentation of papers by the scholars reflecting various aspects of the theme from different angles. The excellent presentations graced the seminar. These presentations were followed by interaction between paper presenters and the audience and final remarks by the chair. The house disappeared after the vote of thanks and final updates from the organiser about the next day event.

Day Two: 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2017.

“The Moral Dilemma between Life and Death: East and West”

**Fourth session** of the second day was chaired by Prof. Nirmalya Narayan Chakraborty, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Rabindra Bharati University and two eminent speakers were Dr. Jayasish Chakraborty, Consultant Gynaecologist, MEDICA Super Speciality Hospital, AMRI Hospital and Sri Snehasis Sur, Senior Journalist, Doordarshan Kendra, Kolkata.

Dr. Chakraborty's presentation titled “Dilemma in Life and Death from medical aspect” highlighted the medical issues which are being questioned on ethical ground. Discussions were made on the issues of abortion, euthanasia, surrogacy etc. This paper emphasised on the morality of cloning by raising the question, have we, the human being, got the right to create the life of an animal or human, going against the way of nature or God? This paper attempted to search the common point between science and philosophy incorporating the ‘Unified Field Theory’ of Albert Einstein and immortality of soul or ‘Atman’ from Bhagabatgita. Another paper titled “Unnatural Death and its depiction in Media” by Sri Sur attempted to examine the role of media in handling the issue of death especially unnatural death. This paper pointed out that unnatural death gets priority to media because of the mystery behind the death.

These presentations were admired by the scholars. This was the most interactive session of the day. The success of any session may be judged by the questions and queries it created in the mind of the audience. One of the scholars asked the speaker, which one is preferable, quantity of life or quality of life, which was beautifully answered by saying it depends on personal choice.

**Fifth Session** was chaired by Dr. Bhaskarjit Neog and had Prof. N.N. Chakraborty and Prof. A. Nataraju as speakers.

Paper titled “Remnants of Death” by Prof. Chakraborty attempted to decipher the reason behind our reluctance to accept death as inevitable. This paper brilliantly exhibited that our ignorance about the nature of death is the reason behind our fear of death. In this regard he mentioned the conversation between Yudhisthira and ‘Dharma in the disguise of crane’ from the Mahabharata and also the opinion of Socrates about death. This paper also pointed out about the remnants of death by making difference between the ‘thick-self’ and the ‘thin-self’. He mentioned that thick-self is that self which has a history, that is the remnants which are left after death and due to these remnants we use proper name while talking about a dead person though it has no referent.

Next presentation was made by Prof. A. Nataraju titled “Theory of Creation in Upanisads: Some observations”. This paper attempted to explore the basic idea of the creation of

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universe and evolution of life from the Upaniṣadic literature and to construct a Vedāntic living model i. e. re-orienting our life and world in bringing collective human welfare.

These presentations were also followed by Q&A and final remarks by the Chair.

**Session Six** started after a refreshing lunch break. This session was chaired by Prof. Priyambada Sarkar and the speaker was Prof. Aparajita Mukhopadhyay, Department of Philosophy, Jadavpur University. Her presentation titled “Causes of Moral Dilemma” attempted to search the reasons behind moral dilemma. In this context, she mentioned the opinion of Immanuel Kant who denies the possibility of moral dilemma. By explaining Thomas Nagel’s view she concluded that situation is responsible for dilemma or it is our circumstantial luck due to which we enter in dilemmatic situations.

This presentation was followed by interactive session. One question was raised from the Chair that how circumstantial luck be responsible for moral dilemma? The speaker’s answer was dilemma appears by circumstantial luck is not actual dilemma; it is just an apparent dilemma.

This session continued with the presentation of papers by the scholars, chaired by Prof. A. Nataraju. After a short interactive session, rapporteur presented a brief report of the seminar including almost all the important conclusions which were derived from the presentations of this two-day seminar.

The **last session** was valedictory, the closing session of the day. The Valedictory Address was delivered by Prof. Priyambada Sarkar, Department of Philosophy, University of Calcutta. In her address she highlighted the issues of moral dilemma from Indian perspective i. e. Buddha and Jaina perspective. She expressed hope that the department will take initiative to arrange such programme in near future. Her thoughts weaved the seminar completely with its title.

The organizer extended vote of thanks to all and especially to ICPR without whose help and cooperation it could not have been possible to hold such a grand event. With this the closure of the event was announced.

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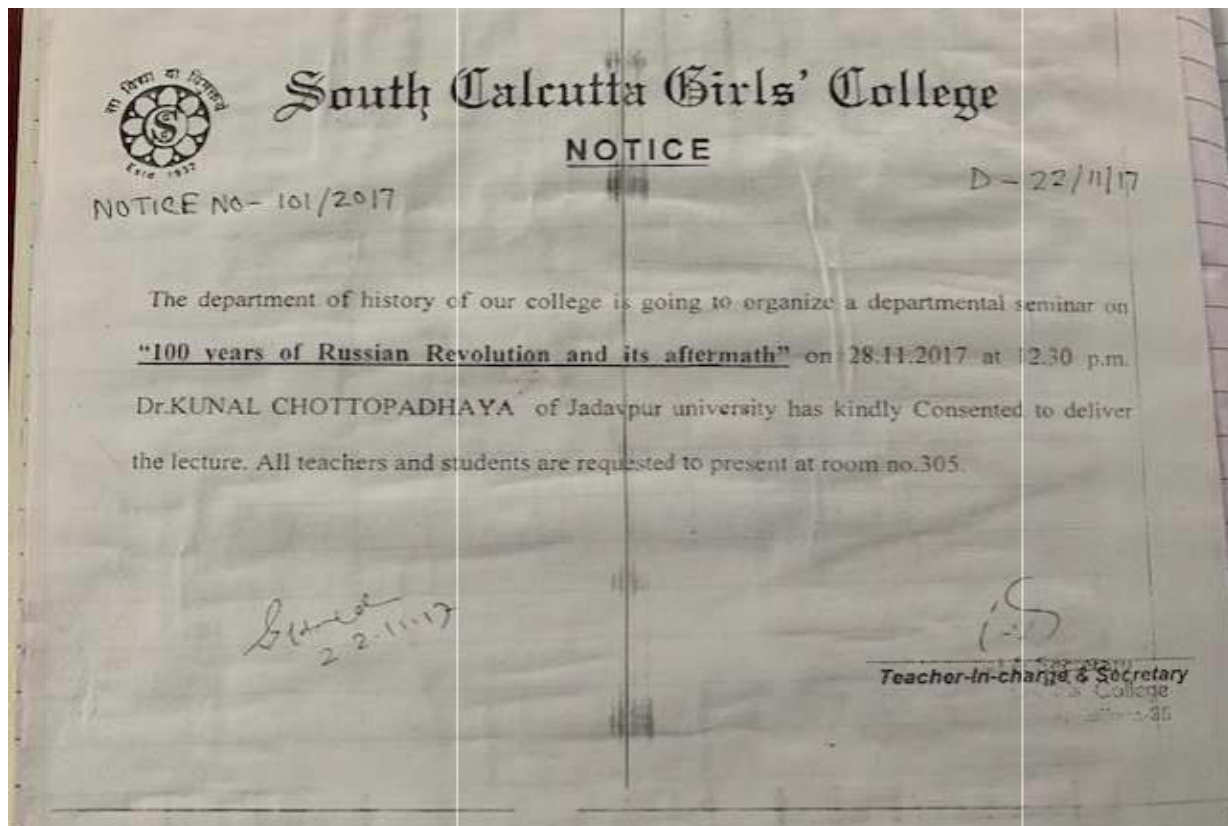

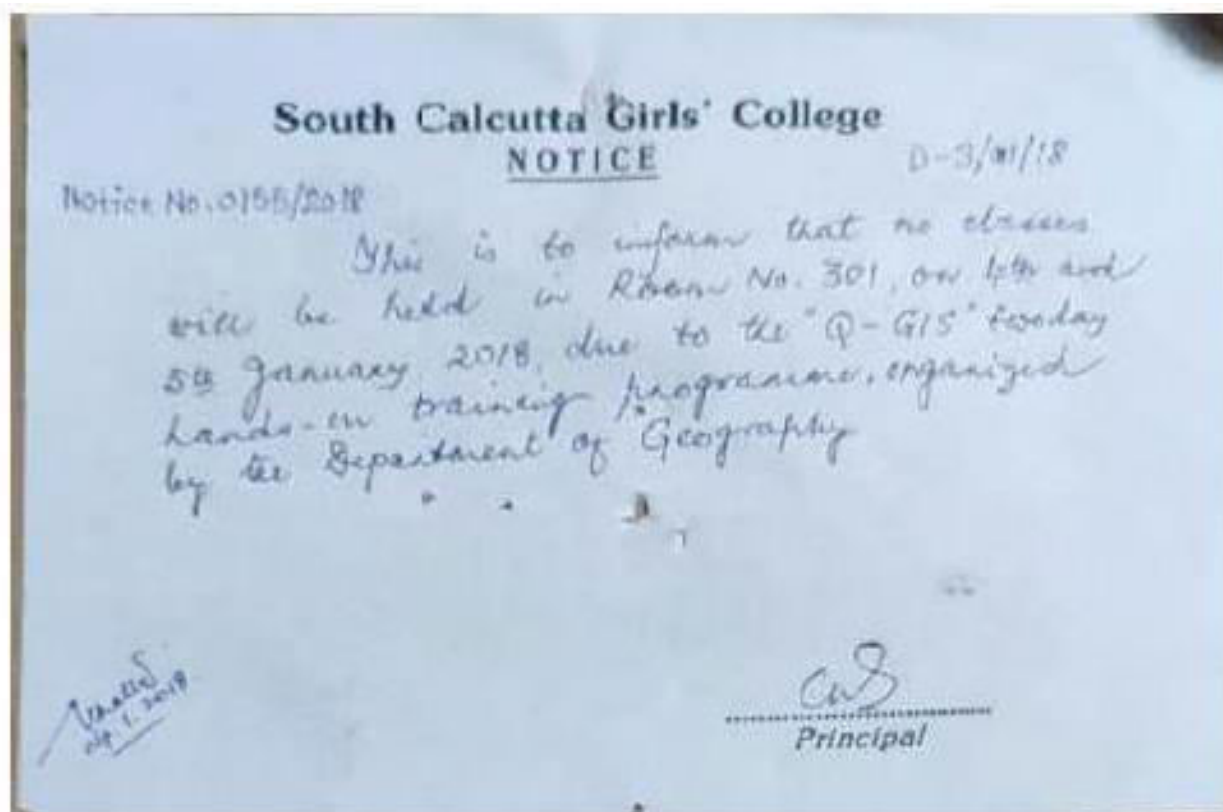

The topic of the lecture was "The Nature of Human Being: East and West." The Speaker was Dr. J.L. Shaw, Professor of Philosophy, Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand. 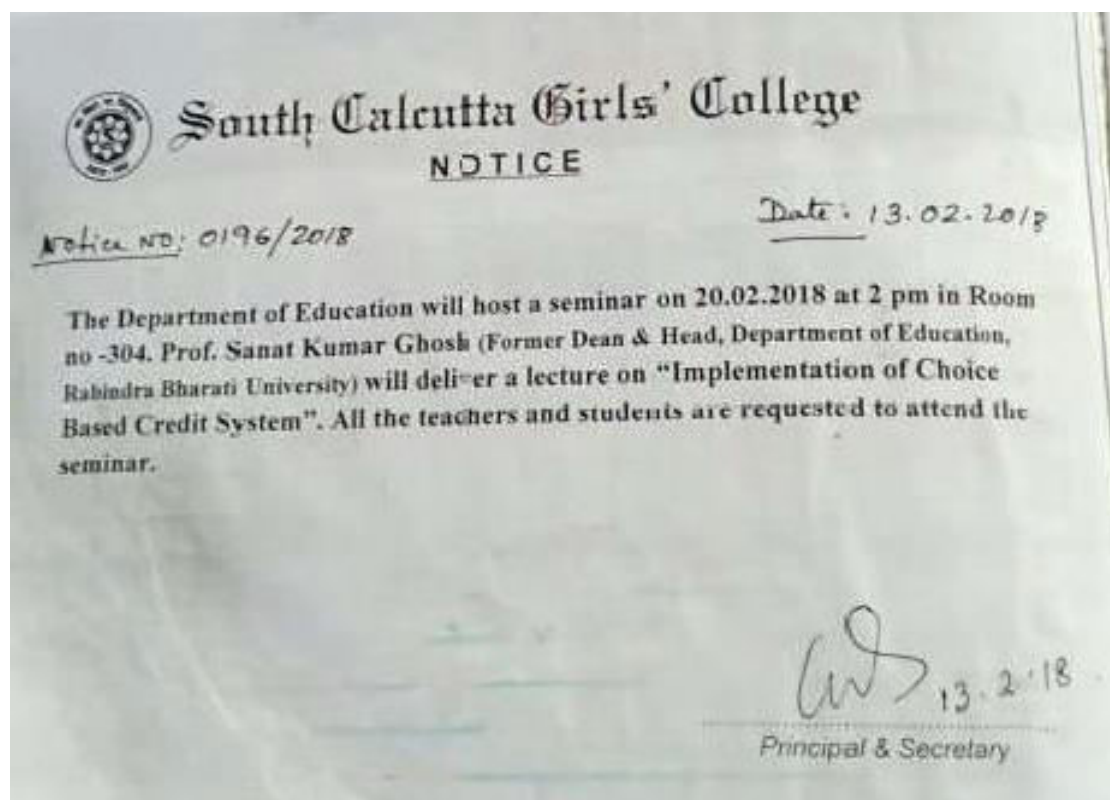

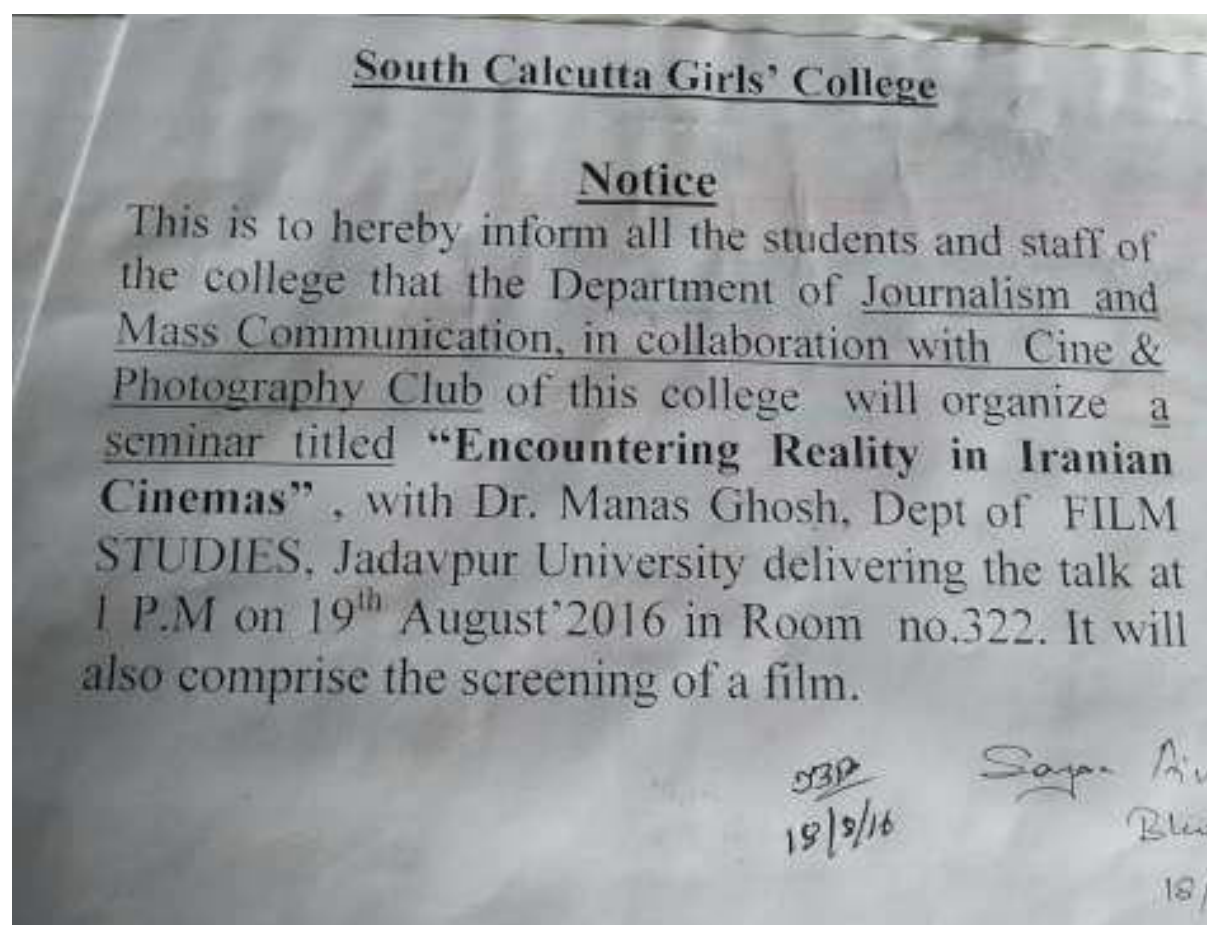
## Department of Journalism & Mass Communication, 2016-2017

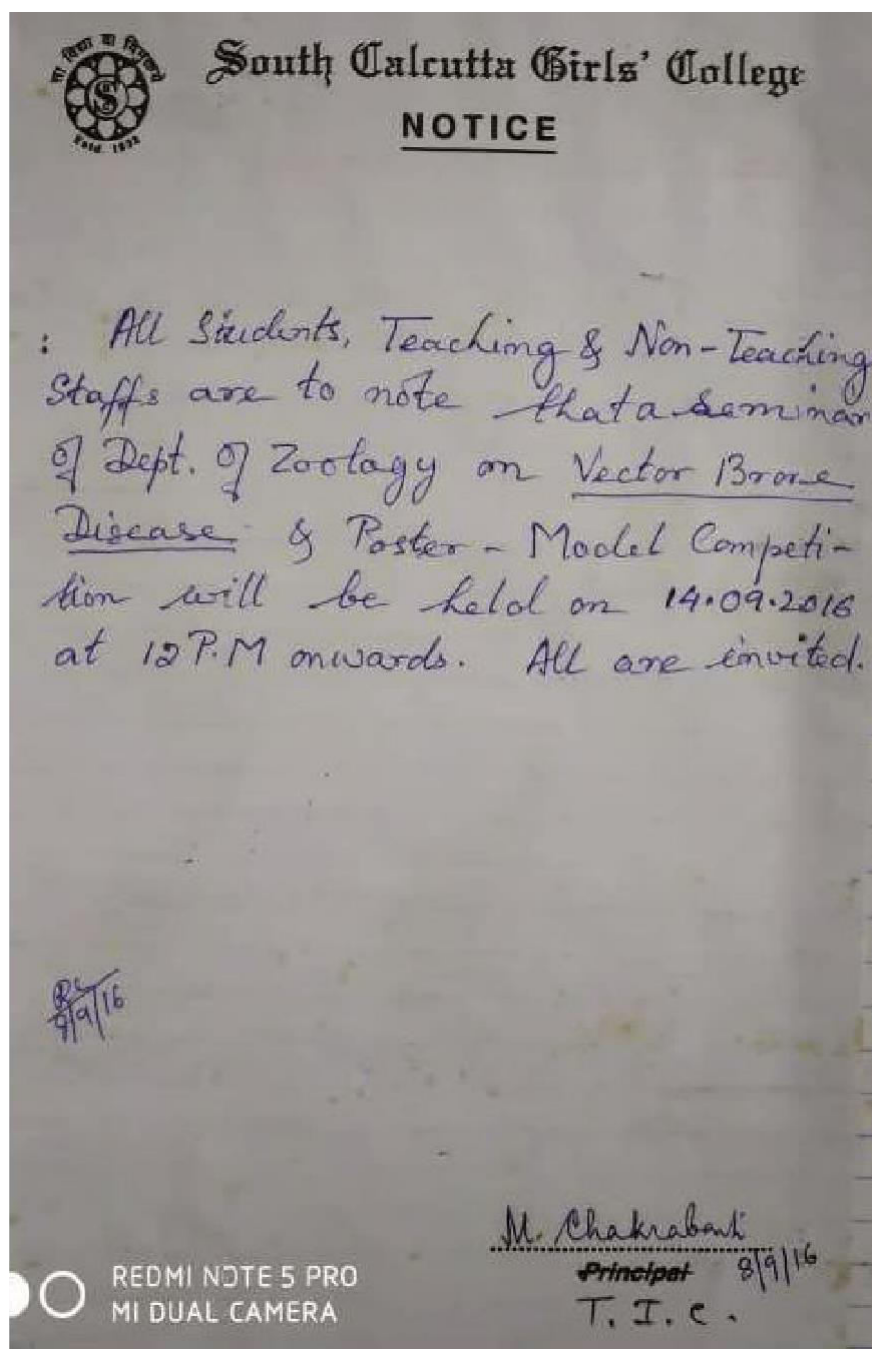

Dr.ASHOK KUMAR MUKHOPADHYAY

He did his PhD from Kolkata University (School of tropical Medicine) on *Anopheles stephensi* mosquitoes, the vector of Urban malaria. He joined National Vector Borne Diseases Control Dept, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, under Government of India after clearing UPSC. Since 1982 to 2012 he extensively worked on vector borne diseases like malaria, filariasis, kala razr and published 70 scientific papers in Indian & foreign Journals including WHO journals. The Best Public Health Medicine award, “A P Ray award” presented by Govt. of India in 2014.

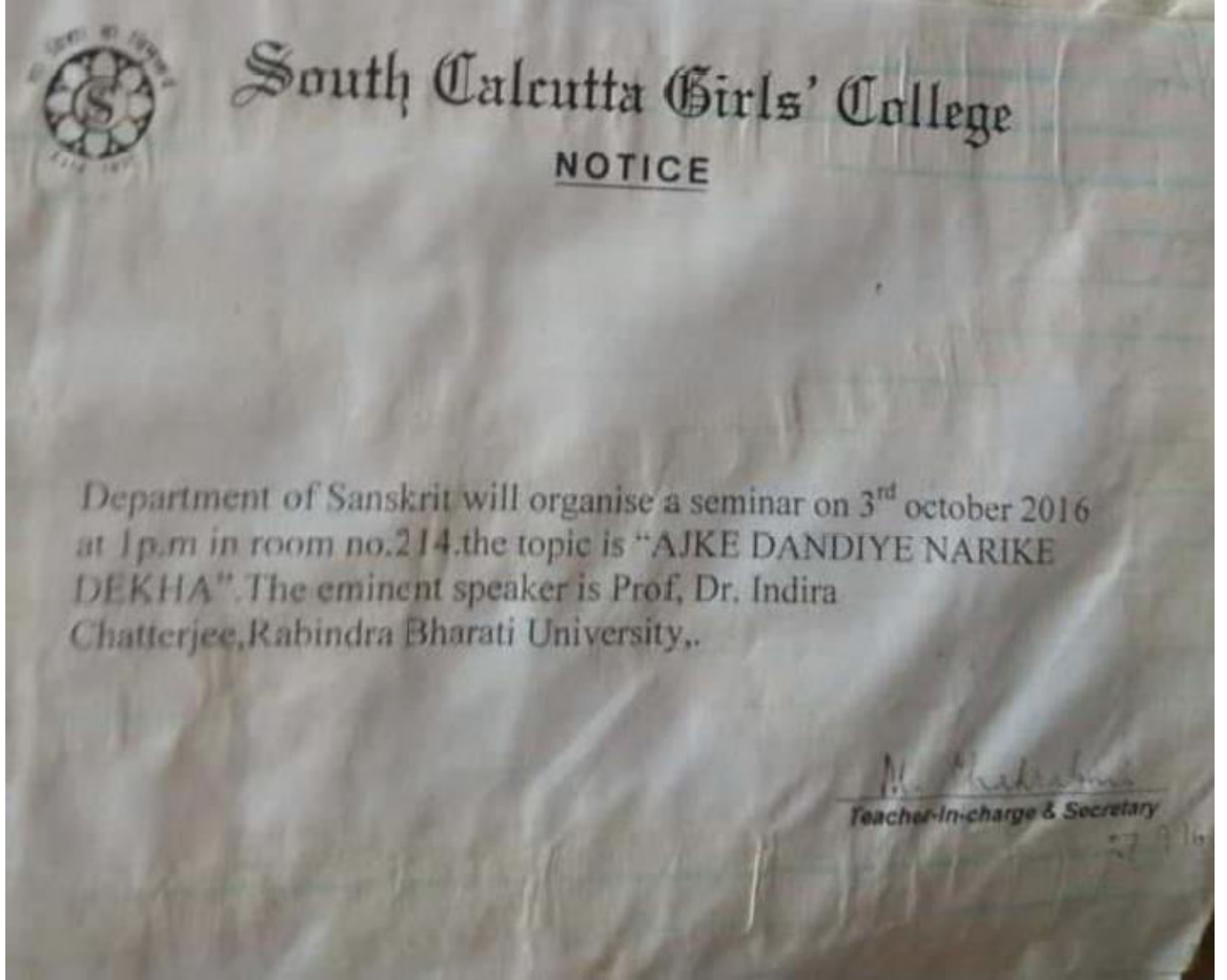

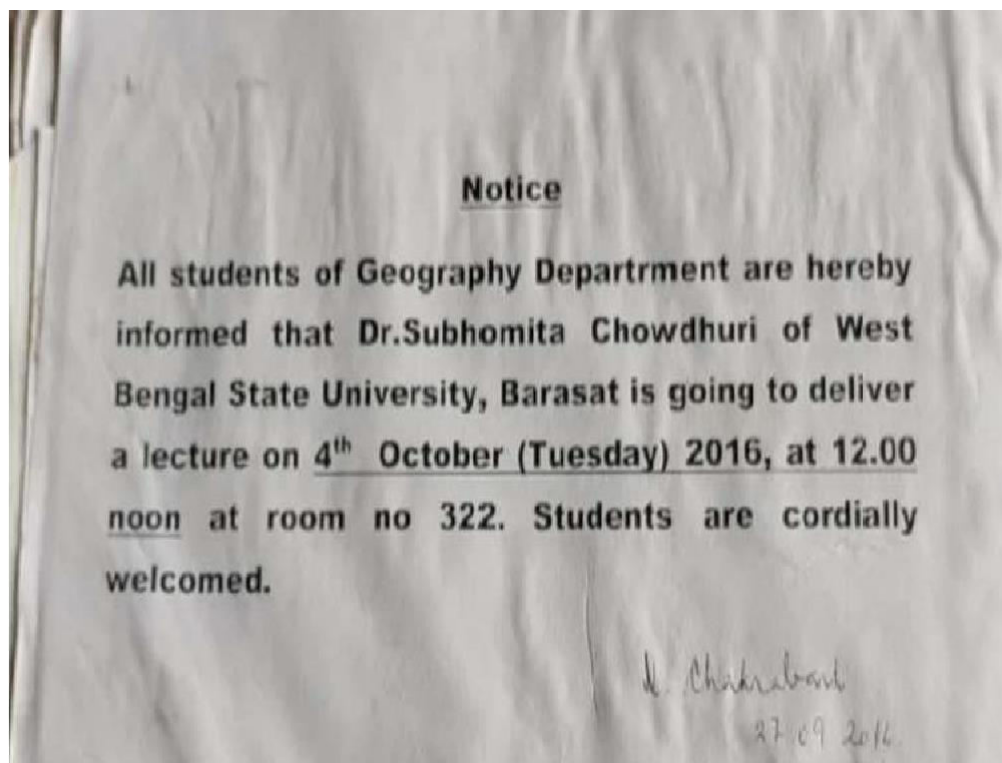
