COLLEGE PROFILE

South Calcutta Girls' College has a special position in Kolkata heritage. It is the first college established for women in south of Kolkata in 1932 by eminent scholars and educationists like Peary Mohan Chatterjee, after whom the college library is named. It was initially a sister organization of the Beltala Girls' School and functioned as a morning college in the school premises till mid July, 1946. The College then shifted to 72, Sarat Bose Road, Kolkata - 700025, where it stands now. The College celebrated its Platinum Jubilee in 2006-07.

MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

Our College is dedicated to the all-round development of young women, helping them to face the challenges of the modern world. Besides, encouraging educational achievements, our institution also lays emphasis on fostering self-confidence and inculcating the right values so that our students can develop themselves as responsible and aware citizens.

On 2023, in the third NAAC visit this esteemed institution has been awarded Grade A.

The total sanctioned amount under RUSA 2.0 is two crore. The college has received Rs one crore in 2019 - 20, and Rs fifty lakh in 2020 - 21.

Library: The College has a fine library stocked with over 22,000 books and journals and a spacious reading room. Besides the Central Library, there are Departmental Seminar Libraries which stock text and reference books, photocopies of important articles and model question papers. Students also enjoy the facilities of **e-books** and **e-jouanals**.

Hostel: South Calcutta Girls' College is the only College in the southern part of the city that offers hostel facility. It can at present accommodate 60 boarders. The hostel efficiently runs on a low cost basis and great attention is paid to the cleanliness of the premises, food, discipline and well being of the students.

Sports: The College does not have adequate space for outdoor games but it encourages students who have excelled at the District or State level games. There is regular participation in Inter-College Sports Meet. An annual college sports is organized in the month of December. The college has introduced KARATE training and YOGA classes for the students. A badminton court is another addition in the sphere of sports and games.

Clubs: There are various interactive clubs which add to the vibrancy of the campus life. The Film and Cine Club frequently organizes film screening for the students and interested viewers from the surrounding locality. The Eco Club has been instrumental in organizing World Environment Day. Poster - presentation competition of students are organized to bring awareness regarding the green environment surrounding us. More clubs are added to the existing one, viz. Cultural Club, Quiz Club, Physical Activity Club, Social Awareness Club etc. Very recently, Electoral Literacy Club has been added in this group.

Social: The College Social, organized annually, is a platform to showcase in-house talent. The inter college fest "**Bahar**" organized by the Students' Union, is a vibrant cultural affair that facilitates interaction and creativity among students of different colleges.

Laboratories: Bio-Science (Botany, Physiology and Zoology), Chemistry, Geography, Journalism and Mass Communication, Psychology Laboratories are well equipped and students receive individual attention.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

The educational tours are organized from time to time by all the departments to support classroom teaching. Excursions are compulsory for the students of Botany, Zoology, Physiology and Geography departments.

NSS

A unit of National Service Scheme has been functioning in our college since 2009. In the year 2023-24, the NSS has organized several programmes. The Dengue Awareness Programme focussed to prevent the spread of the disease in the nearby slum area. Consumer Awareness Programme was held in collabration with West Bengal National University of Judicial Science. In a Lecture-session of this programme, eminent speakers delivered lectures to enlighten students in different aspect of consumer awareness . World Environment Day was observed through plantation programme. To co-memorate Kargil Vijay Dewas, another captivating programme was arranged where Mr. Samir Kumar Mitra, DIG, BSF (Retired) delivered his lecture. A colourful rally was organized on 12th and 13th October 2023, to glorify Khadi-Mahotsov. On Red-Ribbon day, lectures on HIV-AIDS were delivered by Durbar Mahila Sammannaya Committee. National Sports Day, Communal Harmony Day, National Youth Day were the other notable programmes which were observed and organized by the NSS unit of this esteemed Institution with full enthusiasm. In '7' -Day Special Camp "health check-up programmes" were also arranged where eminent experts were invited to make the programme a success.

MENTOR-MENTEE SYSTEM AND PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

A strong student mentoring system is available in this institution which has been introduced since 2019-20. A database of students containing the personal, academic, financial, health, extra-curricular activity details are prepared and maintained by the mentor. The overall development of a student is monitored and guided by the mentor.

A Parent-Teacher interaction is held in each and every semester to discuss the progress of the students. Guardians feedback is taken in such meetings.

COUNSELLING CELL

The psychological counselling cell is always committed to serve students a stress free environment. This cell of South Calcutta Girls' College started its journey from September 2014. The working hours is on every Wednesday from 12 noon to 4 P.M. There is a separate, well-maintained counselling room which provides personal counselling with confidentiality. Regular group sessions on serveral topics are conducted to create general awareness among students. The Cell also celebrates World Suicide Prevention Day and World Mental Health Day every year. Counselling Cell tries to awake positive career choices among students and explore their interest, goal and aspiration.

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell of South Calcutta Girls' College helps students prepare for their upcoming step into the professional world and get placement in a job profile they want according to their qualifications and skills. In the session 2023-2024, few awareness programmes were organized by the cell. On 07.07.2023, Dr. Krishnendu Das, Associate Professor of the Department of Zoology from City College had delivered a lecture on the topic-Career Guidelines for Bioscience students. Students took great interest in it. Students attended the Awareness Programme on Diploma in PC Application conducted by Webel on 5.8.2023.

Awareness Programme on Competitive Examination was organised by the Placement Cell on 15.09.2023.

To prepare students for facing the interviews and to inform them about job requirements, the placement cell provides thorough guidance regarding placement driver organised by different companies to recruit students from various fields. On 29.08.2023, students attended the BOPTER job fair at Vedanta College, Kolkata. Students also attended TCS BPS 2024 Campus Event on 15.09.2023. Placement Cell organised a programme on career guidance titled "Transition from Student Life to Professional Life" on 20.03.2024. The impressive lecture by Dr. Kushal De immensely enriched students.

STUDENT SUPPORT FACILITIES

Audio-visual Room: The College is equipped with an audio-visual room for screening of films and Documentaries to supplement regular class room teaching.

Canteen Facility: Canteen facility is provided for the students and staff of the college.

Common Room: It is furnished with indoor games accessories like Table Tennis Board, Carom Board, Chess Board etc. From 2014-15, the Common Room Committee introduced inter-department indoor games competition which commences from last week of August till November. Winners and Runners are awarded.

Gymnasium: It is well equipped and one female Gym-instructor is available there in college hours.

Online Fees Pyment: Payment of fees is done through college portal, where students are to log-in for the necessary payments.

Students' Health Home: The College is concerned about Students' Health. Every student is enrolled on payment of annual subscription of Rs.10 only. Free medical facilities are offered by the "Health Home".

Students' Aid Fund: The College provides half / full free studentship to needy and meritorious students. There is also provision for book-grant to such students.

Students' Union: Every student is a member of the Students' Union (an elected body by the students) which organizes various activities from time to time and takes part in College Management.

Cheap Store: A cheap store within the college premises, stocks University text books, question papers, stationery and other accessories. This store is ready to meet student-requirments.

Travel Concession: Travel concessions are available to students for travel by air, train or bus within India.

Grievance Redressal Cell: Monitored by senior members of the academic staff, the Cell deals with problems faced by students. Students are free to write about their grievances without revealing their identities. Since the COVID Pandemic situation, the cell is working online, where the link is provided in the college website.

Alumnae Association: The Alumnae Association of South Calcutta Girls' College named PRAYAS has taken keen interest in the welfare of the College and its development. It ensures a steady interaction between bonafide and ex-students.

CCTV & Wi-fi Zone: The College is equipped with CCTV facilities to ensure the security of the students.

Vocational Training Course: Tailoring and Beautician Courses have been introduced in our college.

Smart Class Room: A major addition to the facilities for the students are the introduction of smart class rooms.

Job-Orient Course: Webel Informatics Ltd. (A Govt. of West Bengal Undertaking Organization) is providing two year specially designed diploma in PC application course during college hours.

Yoga Class: Online Yoga class has been introduced from August 2020. The target of this programme is to make the students physically and mentally strong and stress free particularly in the pandemic situation.

Rotary Club, Metro City organizes regular health awareness camps.

GENERAL INFORMATION

College Timing: Classes are held from 10.00 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

Discipline: Admission of the student implies an undertaking on the part of the student and their guardians to respect the rules and discipline of the College. Courteous behaviour is what we expect from all and render to all. The College reserves the right to issue Transfer Certificates in case of breach of discipline.

Rules:

- i) The students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- ii) Students must consult the College Notice Board everyday and comply, failing which the College will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them.
- iii) Students must wear the Identity Card issued by the College everyday on the college premises.
- iv) Attendance in regular classes and tutorials is compulsory for the students.
- v) Disciplinary action will be taken against any student using unfair means during examination.
- vi) Students must attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the Institution.
- vii) The tuition fees must be paid through the bank, twice a year, (at the time of admission and in the month of January).
- viii) Students must take their mark-sheets, registration certificates within one month of the issue of notice by the office, failing which the college will not be responsible for the above-mentioned Documents.

ATTENDANCE

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes held shall not be allowed to appear for the concerned Semester Examinations and she has to take admission to the same semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

STUDENTS ARE TO NOTE THAT: RAGGING IS TOTALLY BANNED. RULES OF THE LIBRARY

- On payment of the Library deposit and on production of admission receipt and two copies of recent coloured photos, each student will be provided with a Library Card. *Library Cards are non-transferable*.
- Every student must attend the library and do the library work regularly.
- No student will be allowed in the Library without Library Card.
- Honours students may borrow four books at a time and General course students may borrow two books only. Books must be returned within 15 days from the date of issue.
- If the books are returned after the due date, borrowing facility will be temporarily withdrawn and a fine will be charged.
- Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. Till the damage is made good, the borrower will have no right to use the Library.
- Students must renew their library cards after they are promoted to the next semester.
- Students seeking transfer and students appearing in 6th Semester and Part III Examination must obtain a Clearance Certificate from the Librarian before a Certificate or Admit Card is issued.

PROGRAMME OF STUDY

The College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and offers 4 year B.A/B.Sc (Honours & Honours with Research) and 3 year B.A/B.Sc (Multidisciplinary) Courses of Studies, under Curriculum & Credit, Framework, 2022. Examination pattern and marks distribution in the CCF 2022 system is effective from academic session 2023-24.

OUTLINE OF CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF), 2022, FOR 4 YEAR B.A/B.SC (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH) PROGRAMME.

Category of Subject:

A. <u>Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC)</u>

A course, to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement of the Major Subject.

- **B.** <u>Minor</u>: A subject of same broad discipline to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses other than the major subject.
- **C.** <u>Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)</u>: Ability Enhancement Course is based on knowledge of language. There shall be two AEC Courses:
 - i) Compulsory English ii) Alternative English/Bengali
- **D.** Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): Students shall study 2 SEC based on Major subject in 1st and 3rd rd semester. In the 2nd semester the student can study Artificial Intelligence (for Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (for Humanities & Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned Major subject.
- **E.** Common Value Added Course (CVAC): In the 1st Semester, there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS and one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values.
- F. <u>Summer Internship</u>: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded certificates of 45 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded three-year Single Major Degree of 132 credits
- **G.** <u>Inter Discipline Course (IDC)</u>: There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credit each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. The students shall take IDC from the different subjects other than the Major and Minor subjects.

OUTLINE OF CURRICULAM AND CREDT FRAMEWORK (CCF) 2022, FOR 3-YEAR B.A/B.SC (MULTIDISCIPLINARY) COURSE OF STUDIES

Category of Subjects:

- A. <u>Core Course (CC)</u>: Courses, to be compulsorily studied by a student as the requirement of Core subjects. In order to make different Multidisciplinary subject combinations, the subject of all the discipline have been taken together to create 8 smaller Multidisciplinary pools. The student shall select 3 subjects as core subjects taking not more than one subject from each pool.
- **B.** <u>Minor:</u> A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses than the two core subjects.
- C. <u>Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)</u>: AEC Courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC Courses:
 - I) Compulsory English ii) Alternative English/Bengali
- **D.** Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): The Students shall study 3 SECs, 2 from each of 2 core subjects in 1^{st} and 2^{nd} semesters respectively and in 3^{rd} semester 1 SEC from the Minor Subjects.
- **E.** <u>Common Value Added Course (CVAC)</u>: In the 1st semester, there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values.
- F. <u>Summer Internship</u>: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2^{nd} or 4^{th} or 6^{th} semester. Student completing internship at the end of the 2^{nd} semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded certificate of credits, Students completing Internship at the end of the 4^{th} Semester will be awarded Diploma. Students completing Internship at the end of 6^{th} semester and after successful completion of all the 6 semesters will be awarded

B.A./B.Sc. Degree.

G. <u>Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC)</u>: There shall be 3 IDCS of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. The students shall select IDCS from the subjects other than the concerned core subjects and minor, not more than one from the each of the Multidisciplinary pool. Whenever there is a practical, there will be no tutorial and vice versa.
